



Shared Housing Intervention Program (SHIP)

Eaton County Overview

What is SHIP?

- The Shared Housing Intervention Program is a resource to support homeless families in Eaton County that do not qualify for local, or federal homeless assistance.

Who does SHIP serve?

- Families with school-aged children in Eaton County, that are precariously housed (doubled-up, couch surfing), but not literally homeless.

What does SHIP offer?

- Case Management; Linkages; Financial Literacy Education; Housing Search Assistance; Advocacy.

How do you get in to SHIP?

- A family can be referred by a McKinney-Vento school liaison, homeless service provider, county agency, or self-referral.

What is the goal of SHIP?

- Provide resources and education in an effort to improve family stability, and increase quality of life.

How long can a family be in the program?

- As long as there is a need.
