The Grand Ledge Public School District is in the northern most part of Eaton County, approximately ten miles west of Lansing, MI. The city of Grand Ledge is located on the banks of the Grand River and has population over 7,900 residents. The district is mainly composed of students from middle income families, blending professional and skilled workers employed by the State of Michigan, Michigan State University, and the insurance mecca. Most of the parents have college backgrounds. The students who qualify students qualify for free and reduced lunch make up 27.2% of the student body.

Grade Point Average

Grade point averages are computed on a 4-point scale (A=4.0). All grades are included in the computing except G and PG (for credit) grades or NC (no credit). Classes are weighted equally, and all students are ranked in their class. Beginning with the 2009-2010 school year, Advance Placement courses have a weighted grade (A=5.0, B=4.0, C=3.0, etc).

Post High School Placement

Of the 388 graduates of the class of 2022, 37.8% reported they would attend a four-year college; 27.3% reported they would attend a two-year college, 4% said they were attending a trade school, 2% planned to go into military service, and 30.7% plans to enter the workforce.
